

Building a Snowman Card



Project Skill Level: Beginner

Supplies

Stamps

stamp from Anthony & Burt Sheet #3 – ABFSP03

Paper

5½" x 8½" red cardstock, 5" square white cardstock compatible with Copic markers, 1" x 1½" of silver foil cardstock

Inks

Tuxedo Black Memento (SI), Copic Markers in the following colors – E19, B34, R29, R39, YR68, YG00, YG03, YG17

Accessories

green ribbon, adhesive of your choice, ¼" hole punch, circle templates in 4" and 4½" sizes, scissors or craft knife, atyou Spica glitter pens in #11 gold, #18 baby blue, and #00 clear; silver Sakura Gelly Roll pen

Instructions

1. Fold 5½" x 8½" red cardstock in half. This card will have a top fold. Use the 4½" template to cut a circle for the card base. Be sure to leave about 1½" of the fold at the top of the card. Cut a slice off the bottom of the card about ½" long. This will allow the card to stand up.
2. Fold the silver cardstock in half with the fold at the top. Use the adhesive to attach the "cap" to the card "ornament". Be sure to leave enough room at the top where you can punch a hole.
3. Stamp the image on the white cardstock using the Memento ink.
4. Color the image with Copic Markers. In this example, the carrot was colored with YR68. R29 and R39 were used on the ear muffs and hat. Use the B34 marker for the scarves. Use the E19 color on the snowman's limbs. The frog was colored by blending the YG00, YG03 and YG17 markers. Use the atyou Spica glitter pen # 18 baby blue on the outline of the snowman and the snowball in the frog's hand. Also use it for the snow on the ground and the snowflakes. Use it for the outline of the fly's wings also. Use the silver Gelly Roll to color the top of the ear muffs. Color in the fly's wings, the snowball, and the snowman with the clear glitter pen.
5. Use the 4" circle template to cut out the colored image.
6. Use the adhesive to attach the colored image to the middle of the red cardstock.
7. Thread ribbon through the hole in the silver foil cardstock.
