

Stamp Kissing Technique ATC

Project Supplies

Stamps:

ATC Stamp Set 3 and ATC Mini Words (SI)

Paper:

mustard yellow cardstock and Xerox Flecs Cover stock each 2½" x 3½", scrap of white cardstock

Ink:

brown #879, gold #985 and green #098 Tombow markers, Versacolor cubes in #34 Orchid and #151 Sand Beige, Memento London Fog

Accessories:

adhesive of your choice, foam mounting tape, craft knife with sharp blade, pencil, small detail scissors

Directions

1. Cut Flecs Cover stock to 2 3/8" x 3 3/8". Stamp "good luck" stamp, colored with green marker, at the top of the paper.
2. Color a flower stamp with the Tombow markers. Stamp under the "good luck" image.
3. Apply the sand ink to the solid vase. Ink the butterfly with the orchid ink. Stamp the butterfly onto the vase. Using the double inked vase, stamp onto scrap white cardstock. This is the image you will use for the ATC. Stamp again onto the scrap cardstock making sure to leave at least ½" around the image.
4. Use scissors to cut out the first stamped vase for the ATC. Cut out the second image, using the craft knife, out of the scrap paper leaving an uncut border around the negative of your image. This is a reverse mask.
5. Place the image for the ATC where you will want it when card is finished. Place a light pencil mark where the bottom of the image will be on the card. Put image to the side. Line up the image cut out for the mask with the pencil mark.
6. Decide where you will want the shadow from the flowers and vase to be. Stamp the gray ink onto the flower stamp. Stamp off onto the scrap paper. You will want to stamp the flower in a very light color. When you achieve a good shadow color, stamp away from the main image leaving room for the vase shadow.
7. Now lightly apply ink to the reverse mask area for the vase.
8. Attach foam mounting tape to the back of the final vase image. Place the vase onto the ATC being sure to line it up with the pencil mark.
9. Use adhesive to put the flower card onto the mustard yellow cardstock.
